DIGNITARIES DRUM SUPPORT FOR FUTA CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Dignitaries at the Capital Campaign Launch of the Federal University of Technology, Akure have expressed their support for the aspirations of the University to source for external funds in order to sustain its position as the best University of Technology in Nigeria, and compete with the best Universities in the world.

Speaking during the programme which was held at the Transcorp Hilton, Abuja, the former Head of State, General (Dr.) Yakubu Gowon described the event as a demonstration of ambition by the University to diversify its sources of income to meet various developmental needs as the Federal Government alone cannot provide all the funds required by the University in view of the many other competing sectoral demands.

General Gowon, who is also the Goodwill Ambassador of the University said that FUTA has responded well to the challenges facing tertiary education by finding an alternative way of generating fund instead of complaining about the inability of government to fund higher Institutions of learning.

The former Head of State opined that contributing to scholarship fund will help the University to attract and motivate students, while donation of equipment and infrastructure like lecture theatres, laboratories and hostel accommodation will improve the learning condition of the students.

In his goodwill message, the Ondo State Governor, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko pointed out that investment in FUTA is investment in the future of the country, noting that the University is solely carrying the responsibility of technological liberation of the country.

While describing FUTA as a great University, Governor Mimiko remarked that the relevant and liberating researches carried out in the University have shown the intention and concern of the Institution for the development of the country.

Dr. Mimiko therefore commended the good relationship between the University, its host community and the state government, adding that donations to the institution will be paid back in quality graduates and researches.

Also speaking, the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council, Brigadier-General Raji Rasaki (Retd) highlighted the needs of the University to the tune of five billion naira. He assured that the donations will not only put the donors on the roll of honour of FUTA, but also serve as great impetus to the generations of scholars that will pass through the University.

The Pro-Chancellor acknowledged the efforts of the founding fathers of the Institution for laying a solid foundation that has enabled the University attain its current lofty heights. He promised that FUTA will not derail from the path but continue to champion the nation's march towards rapid technological and industrial development.

In his words, the Chief Promoter of the campaign, Lt. General T.Y. Danjuma reiterated that the challenges facing Nigerian Universities prompted FUTA to source for external fund. He appealed to well-meaning Nigerians to support the ambition of the University.

Represented by Major-General Tanko Abdu, Lt. General Danjuma maintained that the pronouncement of the Institution by the National Universities Commission as the best University of Technology in Nigeria is not a fluke, saying all the accolades the University has received from individuals and corporate bodies are very well deserved.

Lt. General Danjuma, however, enjoined the University to continue on its research and development efforts which had brought it into prominence.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Adebisi Balogun, in his remarks, described the Capital Campaign Launch as another great leap in the Institution's effort to accomplish its vision of becoming one of the best Universities of Technology in the world.

Professor Balogun, who recalled that he packaged the objectives of his administration for the realization of the mission and vision of the University as contained in its

strategic plan revealed that the constituted Advancement Board is set up to source funds, endowments, grants, facilities and equipment, and to monitor, manage and ensure that both the University and its benefactors have fulfillment and satisfaction for their investment.

He informed that the University has made the best of previous contributions in various forms such as the execution of physical projects, administration of research grants in accordance with donors' interest and so on. The Don added that the cash donations are kept in a dedicated account and managed and disbursed in line with the approved guidelines by the Advancement Board.

Other dignitaries at the event were the representative of the Chancellor of the University, the Emir of Lafia, His Royal Highness, Alhaji (Dr) Isa Mustafa, Chairman of the occasion, Alhaji (Dr). Bamanga Tukur, Senator Ayo Akinyelure, representative of the Federal Ministry of Education, Reverend Chris Ogaji, representative of the Executive Secretary, National Universities Commission, Ondo State Commissioner for Education, Dr. Pius Osunyanmi, and Principal Officers of the University, among others.

FUTA GETS NEW REGISTRAR, APPOINTS MORE PROFESSORS, OTHERS

Authorities of the Federal University of Technology, Akure have approved the appointment of Dr. (Mrs) Modupe Olayinka Ajayi as the Institution's Registrar.

Dr. (Mrs) Ajayi joined the University as an Administrative Officer I in April, 1992. She rose through the ranks as Assistant Registrar, Senior Assistant Registrar, Principal Assistant Registrar and Deputy Registrar between 1995 and 2008. She became the Acting Director of the Directorate of Establishment and Human Resource in May, 2009 and held forth till May 2011 before she assumed office as Registrar on 1st June 2011.

Dr. (Mrs) Modupe Ajayi has a Bachelor of Arts (Ed) degree in English Language from the University of Benin, Benin City, a Master's degree in Public Administration from Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife and a Ph.D in Management Science from the Federal University of Technology, Akure.

She is married and blessed with children.

In a related development, the Institution has promoted some of its Readers to the position of Professors. The affected members of staff include Dr. Niyi Okunlola of the Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension, Dr. Igbekele Ajibefun, also of the same Department and Dr. I.A. Adebayo of the Department of Animal Production and Health.

Similarly, Dr. (Mrs) M.T. Olaleye of the Department of Bio-Chemistry, Dr. B. Adeyemi of the Department of Physics and Dr. F.K. Omole of the Department of Urban & Regional Planning have been promoted to the position of Reader, while Dr. (Engr) B.A. Adegboye has been appointed Reader in the Department of Electrical/Electronics Engineering.

Also, Management has appointed a new Director for the Physical Planning Unit. He is Bldr. Shola Dare, while Mr. J.A. Falope is the new Deputy Director for the University Internal Audit Department.

FUTA TO BOOST FOOD PRODUCTION IN NIGERIA

Determined to boost food production in the country, the Federal University of Technology, Akure, has ceaselessly engaged its students in practical agriculture.

While distributing fertilizers to nearly 3,000 students of the Institution on the Institution's Teaching and Research Farm, as part of the requirement to successfully cross from two hundred to three hundred level, Head of Department of Crop, Soil and Pest Management, Professor Rex Aladesanwa said that students are assessed on how well they maintain their plots.

Professor Aladesanwa noted that since the inception of the Institution in 1982, offering the course, general agriculture had been a tradition in FUTA, as passed by the senate of the University.

The don who said the culture is necessary, bearing in mind that agriculture is the major occupation in Nigeria, said fertilizer application to maize crop is to increase the fertility of the soil and boost output.

Professor Aladesanwa enjoined local farmers not to hesitate coming to FUTA farm to seek advise when confronted with problems on their farms.

The Farm Manager, Mr. Adedayo Olajide explained that fertilizer application is usually done in two stages, the first being the MPK which is applied at the growing stage while Uria is applied at the tasselling stage.

Commenting on post harvest management, Mr. Adedayo asserted that the University farm is not often confronted with the problem of post harvest crisis as many storage strategies have been put in place to forestall wastage.

DON REITERATES NEED FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF RESEARCH CENTRES

There is need for the Federal Government to establish Research Centres to cover all areas of Radio Communications and Space Research and employ resident scientists to manage the centres in order to further enhance the qualitative input from the academia in the area of Space Research and Technology.

The Director, Centre for Space Research and Application (CESRA), Federal University of Technology, Akure, Professor Moses Ajewole gave the advice while delivering the 62nd Inaugural lecture of the University.

The professor of Communication Physics who revealed that solid state physics and electronics are central to any development in telecommunication, urged the Federal Government to put more effort in space research and application.

The Lecturer described the establishment of the centre for Space Research and Application by the University as commendable and called on the Federal Government to give adequate fund and other necessary support to accelerate the operations of the centre.

Professor Ajewole informed that lack of adequate power supply had contributed to the low level of development in the country, adding that research in Nigerian Universities has been hampered by the lack of adequate power supply.

He lauded the Federal Government for the establishment of the National Space Research and Development Agency (NASRDA), and recommended that the agency should be adequately funded to enable it fulfill the vision of government.

The Lecturer suggested the handing over of the abandoned facilities of the Nigerian Television Authority to Universities and Research Centres to be used as Teaching and Research Stations.

Professor Ajewole reiterated that effort must be made to produce the critical mass of young men and women that will make it possible for the country to join the comity of advanced nations in the future.

The lecture was attended by Royal Fathers, Members of the Academia, Community Leaders and friends and family members of the Inaugural Lecturer.

FUTA CMS LTD CHARGED CIVIL SERVANTS ON ENTREPRENEURIAL ACTIVITIES

Civil servants in Nigeria have been charged to develop great interest in entrepreneurial activities as a way of sourcing for additional income in order to improve their standard of living.

The Chief Executive Officer, Concept and Actualities Limited, Mr. Wale Akinyanmi gave the advice while delivering a paper during the Cooperative Multipurpose Society Limited Workshop organized by the Federal University of Technology, Akure branch.

The Lecturer, who stated that family business is the world's dominant form of business organization revealed that family businesses in most developed countries account for more than fifty percent of gross domestic product and business activities.

He maintained that Nigeria's political leaders can assist in creating an entrepreneurial economy by providing a vibrant entrepreneurial sector that is supported by civic culture that treasures the passion, imagination, energy and intelligence of citizens.

Mr. Akinyanmi suggested that the government should orientate, educate, facilitate and nurture individual and social enterprises by providing free confidential, competent and caring management advice to those that want to transform their dreams into new business capable of providing livelihood for them, their families and the community at large.

The Lecturer added that business ideas can be conceived from areas like housing, automobile, food production, clothing, poultry keeping, catering services, baking, soap making and many more.

In his remarks, the Chairman, FUTA Cooperative Multipurpose Society Limited, Dr. S.A. Anjorin said that the idea of the first workshop is conceived to discourage members of the society from dependency on salaries for survival.

He promised that the society will strive to ensure that the organization of workshops of this type is sustained so as to improve the standard of living of its members.

Earlier, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Adebisi Balogun commended the impacts of the cooperative society on members saying it has helped to make ends meet.

Represented by his deputy in charge of Academic, professor Debo Adeyewa, the Vice-Chancellor urged the executive and members of the cooperative on integrity and sincerity saying they are the hallmark of success.
