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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is a practical/ field experience for Students at 300 level go for two (2) weeks training at Fisheries and Aquaculture establishments to acquaint themselves with the operation methods in fish farms or establishments. Students are to write and submit Technical report at the end of the field trip for assessment by the panel of academic staff in the Department.
